The University of Southern Denmark welcomed its first students onto the campus in Odense in September 1966. They now have five faculties with more than 27,000 students, almost 20% of whom are from abroad, and have consistently been ranked as one of the top 50 young universities in the world by both the Times Higher Education World University Rankings and the QS World University Rankings. Students can choose to study at the main campus in Odense, third-largest city in Denmark and less than two hours from Copenhagen by train, or at any of the four regional campuses in Slagelse, Kolding, Esbjerg and Sønderborg.

Course Requirements:	Exchange students are expected to take 30 ECTS credits per semester of study. 30 ECTS credits are equal to 15 credits at StFX. 6 ECTS credits are equal to 3 credits at StFX.	
Course Restrictions:	The Health Science courses 'Ageing, Physical Activity and Health: From Theory to Practice' and 'Best Practice in Childhood Physical Activity and Health' are Intensive Programs (IP) with a very condensed teaching period and so are not recommended for exchange students.

Cost:	€2000 - €3000 DKK per month. (Equivalent to approximately \$455 - \$600 CAD)
Details:	All campuses guarantee accommodation for students from partner universities.

OTHER COSTS	
Health Insurance:	All StFX students are required to purchase travel health insurance for the duration of their time abroad. Link Additionally, if you are staying in Denmark for at least three months, you are automatically included in the Danish Health Insurance Scheme which gives you the right to free medical treatment by general practitioners and in hospitals – but not dentists. Link
Living Expenses:	<u>Link</u>
Visa:	Anyone studying for more than 3 months in Denmark must apply for a student permit. Once your enrolment is approved by the Danish educational institution, a two-part application form will be forwarded to you with Part 2 filled out by the host institution. Link The cost is DKK 1455 (\$305 CAD). Link *Please note that travel to the nearest Danish consulate or embassy will be required to apply for the student permit.
