The International School of Management is a reputed German business school, known as a center for innovative thinking and research. The school focuses on different frontiers of research areas, including internationalization of the economy, energy and environmental economics, tourism, logistics and information, finance and banking, marketing and communication, leadership and motivation, and organization and human resources, and has seven campuses across Germany. StFX students are able to study at the largest campus in Dortmund, which is only 15 minutes from the city center. Dortmund is the largest city in the Rhine-Ruhr metropolitan region, and is made up of wooded areas, farmland, and parks, as well as numerous waterways and pedestrian walkways.

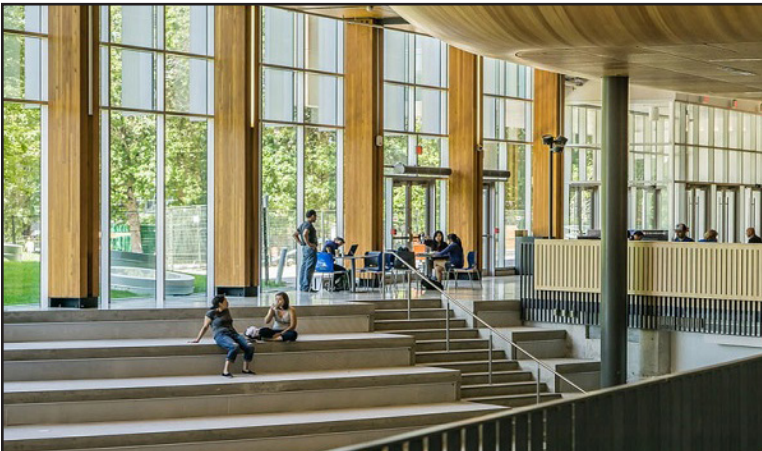

<b>Course Requirements:</b>	Exchange students are expected to take 30 ECTS credits per semester of study. 30 ECTS credits are equal to 15 credits at StFX. 6 ECTS credits are equal to 3 credits at StFX.
<b>Course Restrictions:</b>	Exchange students take one of the following three block's of courses: BLOCK I · Strategic Management · International Business Law · Project Management · Operations Management BLOCK II · Strategic Controlling · Crisis Management · Branding & Communication Management · Doing Business in a Global Economy BLOCK III · International Finance Management · International Trade & Sales · Marketing Controlling · Business Ethics Specializations

<b>Cost:</b>	€270 - €600 per month. (Equivalent to approximately \$405 - \$900 CAD)
<b>Details:</b>	ISM does not offer any on-campus housing. However, the international office of ISM will assist students in finding accommodation by providing them with an Accommodation Guide. The Accommodation Guides are designed with helpful advice and links for off-campus student residences (not managed by ISM), as well as individual apartments.

## OTHER COSTS

<b>Health Insurance:</b>	<p>All StFX students are required to purchase travel health insurance for the duration of their time abroad. <a href="#">Link</a></p> <p>Additionally, all students in Germany are required by law to have health insurance. You will not be allowed to register for courses at the host institution until you have provided proof that you are properly insured.</p> <p><i>Please note:</i> Under German law, a student's private health insurance (whether foreign or German) may not put a limit on their benefits. For example, travel insurance often includes a maximum payment of €30,000 or (\$100,000 USD) for medical treatment. This type of health insurance policy will not be accepted for enrolment as a student; your policy must offer "unlimited" benefits. Moreover, your health insurance must cover both in-patient and out-patient treatment. If an excess (co-pay sum) is stated on the policy, this must not be higher than €5,000. Other benefits included in the travel package (for example, accident insurance or transport back home) may be limited to a certain sum. <a href="#">Link</a></p>

<b>Visa:</b>	Canadian citizens are not required to apply for a German visa before leaving Canada. Students can submit their application after arrival in Germany. <a href="#">Link</a>
