HAN University of Applied Sciences, often abbreviated as HAN, is a vocational university of applied sciences with campuses in Arnhem and Nijmegen. The two cities are 15km apart, and are under two hours by train from Amsterdam. Visitors to this part of the country will be charmed by the typically Dutch scenery of wide rivers, bridges, dikes and polders, set against a background of woody hills and small towns. StFX students have the opportunity to take courses from the Faculty of Health and Social Studies, which feature a Public Health Program offered in the Fall semester, and a Sport and Nutrition program offered in the Winter semester.

Course Requirements:	Exchange students are expected to take 30 ECTS credits per semester of study. 30 ECTS credits are equal to 15 credits at StFX. 6 ECTS credits are equal to 3 credits at StFX.	
Course Restrictions:	StFX students can only take courses from HAN's Faculty of Health and Social Studies. Furthermore, due to the availability of programs, Health students can only complete a Fall semester exchange, and HKIN and HNU students can only complete a Winter semester exchange.

Details:	HAN offers furnished rooms for international students for a maximum of one academic year. Room options are different depending on which campus you choose, Nijmegen or Arnhem.

Health Insurance:	All StFX students are required to purchase travel health insurance for the duration of their time abroad. Link Additionally, as part of the Netherlands residence permit requirements, students are required to show proof of travel and medical insurance valid for the duration of their time in the Netherlands. Visa:	Canadian students need a residence permit (VVR) to study in the Netherlands. HAN University will help you to obtain this AFTER arrival in the country. You will be required to submit documentation and biometrics in order at the time of application. The cost is €317 or ~\$ 465 CAD. Link
