DOCTOR OF LAWS HONORIS CAUSA

DR. JOHN GAVENTA '23 London, UK

Dr. John Gaventa has made significant contributions to grassroots adult education, academic scholarship, and international development over a distinguished career of nearly 50 years. Throughout his work, he has sought to use his research and leadership to support community driven efforts for social change and social justice. A former Director of the Coady Institute and Vice-President, International at StFX, Dr. Gaventa is currently a Professorial Fellow at the Institute of Development Studies, a leading global institution for development research, based at the University of Sussex. Dr. Gaventa was born in the United States, but was raised in Nigeria, where his parents were medical missionaries. He returned to the U.S. to attend Vanderbilt University, and later received his D. Phil. in politics from Oxford, which he attended as a Rhodes Scholar. After graduation, Dr. Gaventa returned to the U.S. and helped lead a grassroots adult educational program at the Highlander Research and Education Centre in Tennessee, where he later served as director. Dr. Gaventa went on to serve as a professor and fellow at the Institute of Development Studies, where he became team leader of the IDS Participation Group, and later Director of Research. While at IDS, he led several large scale collaborative international research programs on themes of citizen participation, local governance and accountability, working with local partners around the world. Internationally respected in his field, he has written widely on issues of citizen-led development and action and has received numerous awards, including a MacArthur Fellowship, and the Tisch Civic Engagement Research Prize from Tufts University. His first book, Power and Powerlessness: Quiescence and Rebellion in an Appalachian Valley, broke new ground in the study of social power and won several major academic prizes. In addition to academic activities, Dr. Gaventa has volunteered many hours working with community groups and non-governmental initiatives. He became a member of the Council of Trustees of Oxfam UK, and later served as its chair. For his work at Oxfam, Dr. Gaventa was appointed an Officer of the Order of the British Empire in 2012.





OUTSTANDING FACULTY TEACHING AWARD

DR. MARY OXNER '87Department of Accounting And Finance

Dr. Mary Oxner joined StFX's Gerald Schwartz School of Business in 2000 to develop and teach courses in the accounting and finance disciplines. Dr. Oxner primarily teaches advanced accounting courses. As an effective and engaged faculty member who enjoys teaching students, Dr. Oxner continuously tries to improve instructional strategies, to provide an engaging and inclusive environment for learning, to layer experiential learning activities into courses, and to encourage transparency in expectations and to challenge students in their learning. "It is clear that she understands and cares about the effect she has on students' wellbeing and learning," wrote one student nominator. Students spoke of her ongoing guidance and encouragement, her demonstrated enthusiasm for their learning, and how she inspires trust and simultaneously challenges students to do their best. Dr. Oxner also involves students in her research. including in the field of financial literacy, working with Indigenous people and refugee newcomers with the aim of improving financial literacy resources. Dr. Oxner consistently incorporates new content into her courses to reflect new accounting approaches to reporting and brings in guest experts to speak. Through it all, she follows advice given by her father, a retired math teacher: "Don't forget that you are teaching PEOPLE!" Prior to joining the business faculty, Dr. Oxner was the Senior Vice President of Quorum Funding Corporation, and Chief Financial Officer of Quorum Growth Inc., a TSX publicly traded closedend investment fund. Dr. Oxner was also a staff accountant in Ernst & Young's International audit group. An active volunteer, her efforts have been recognized through StFX's Outreach Award, as the CA of the Year for the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Nova Scotia and as the inaugural Terry Milne Volunteer of the Year for the Chartered Financial Analysts' Atlantic Canada Society.





PRESIDENT'S RESEARCH AWARD

DR. ERIN MAZEROLLEDepartment of Psychology

Dr. Erin Mazerolle is an assistant professor in the StFX Psychology Department and is cross-appointed to the Computer Science Department. She joined StFX in 2020 and has already established an excellent research track record in reproducibility in brain imaging research, neurovascular impacts on the human brain, neurological diseases, neuroscience knowledge translation, and white matter imaging, Dr. Mazerolle has secured over \$1 million in research funding, spanning NSERC, CIHR, and several other granting agencies. Her innovative, impactful published studies have furthered understanding of neuroimaging methods and the human brain. Remarkably, at this stage in her career, she has already published 47 peer-reviewed journal articles. Her research has pushed the boundaries of what we know about functional magnetic resonance imaging activation in white matter, she has developed unique data analysis pipelines, and she has improved the conceptualization of rare brain conditions. Dr. Mazerolle is also known for her ability to encourage and collaborate with colleagues and students in her own and other disciplines. This year, her work as a mentor and researcher earned an Early Career Research Discovery Award for Science & Innovation nomination. Dr. Mazerolle is also committed to inclusion and social justice in her work, promoting the visibility of women in science, and making neuroscience accessible. She has been involved with science outreach organizations and has been involved in projects focused on sharing neuroscience findings with individuals living with housing instability. This year, she initiated the Antigonish Brain Bee, pairing undergraduate students in her Brain and Behavior course with local high school students to help prepare them to compete in a local neuroscience competition that culminates in a Canadian competition.

Description of Degree Hoods

All hoods for earned degrees at this university follow the approved design and colour coding of the Intercollegiate Bureau of Academic Costume. This guarantees uniqueness of design and colour arrangement for the academic hoods of each university.

For purposes of academic regalia, the university colours are described as Yale blue and white, and they are used in identical fashion in the hoods for all earned degrees. That is to say, the lining for hoods are all the same and serve to identify the university rather than any particular degree. This lining, therefore, is blue divided by a chevron of white.

The binding or edging of the hood is of velvet, two inches wide for all bachelor's degrees and three inches wide for all master's degrees and five inches for PhD. The academic discipline is recognizable from the colour of this velvet binding or trim.

Degree candidates will wear gowns and the hood of the degree to be received. Colours of the lining of the hood are exposed over the left shoulder, velvet trim and black shell on the right shoulder.

Diploma candidates will wear collars. If candidate also has a degree, the colours of that degree should be worn.
