Department of Psychology – Applied Forensic Psychology Program, Limited Term Appointment

The Department of Psychology's Applied Forensic Psychology Program at St. Francis Xavier University invites applications for one (1) 9-month limited term appointment (LTA) to begin August 15, 2024. The Applied Forensic Psychology Program is a relatively new direct entry four-year undergraduate program offered within the Psychology Department at StFX. Successful candidates for this LTA position will have (or be nearing completion of) a PhD in Clinical Forensic or Applied Forensic Psychology. Candidates for this position will be expected to teach clinical forensic courses focused on Corrections and Law (Psyc 381 and 382), as well as Professional Skills and Practicum Training (Psyc 257). The practicum course is designed to prepare students for practicum placements. Preparation for practicum includes skills training for working in various settings with various clinical forensic populations. Current practicum opportunities for AFP students include working with federal and provincial corrections; courts (supreme, provincial, problem solving); community-based organizations (e.g., Elizabeth Fry Society, RCMP); and mental health practitioners (clinical psychologists, social workers). Availability to teach courses in-person is preferred.

About the Psychology Department

The St.F.X. Psychology Department is the largest department in the Faculty of Arts and among the largest within the university. The Department has 17 full-time faculty members with diverse programs of research and funding support, and four lab instructors. Our courses attract students from all disciplines across campus, and we offer degrees in both the Arts and Sciences. We offer an honours program, course-based research experiences, as well as service learning and work-integrated learning opportunities.
